
Well done Busy for winning the attendance Monkey this week!



We have certainly had a lot of different computer applications over the last 18 months

APP	Role
	<p><u>PARENT PAY</u></p> <p>Our cater, Autograph, use Parent Pay as a way of ordering and paying for school lunches.</p>
	<p><u>SCHOOL GATEWAY</u></p> <p>This is the app that we use to pay for trips, camps, school uniform, snack money, anything related to our school that is not lunches.</p>
	<p><u>TAPESTRY</u></p> <p>We use this app to communicate with our parents in Nursery and Reception. The staff in Wheal Friendly will take photos of the children learning but also post messages on there about events and home learning.</p>
	<p><u>CLASS DOJO</u></p> <p>We use this app to communicate with our parents in Year 1 to Year 6. We will use this if any child has to isolate and work from home. Equally if any children would like to share any events from home, they can upload photos on here.</p>
	<p><u>SPELLING SHED</u></p> <p>All the children (Year 1 upwards) are given spellings to practice on a weekly basis. This is done at school but they are linked to Spelling Shed for them to practice at home. All children will have a spelling quiz on a Friday.</p>
	<p><u>NUMBOTS AND TT ROCKSTARS</u></p> <p>As we know, fluency of number bonds and times table is the foundation of mathematics at Primary School. These two apps support this fluency in a fun and exciting way.</p>
	<p><u>GO READ</u></p> <p>This is an app that is an online reading record. This is just for KS2 (Wheal Busy and Luna). Parents / children log their reading each evening for the staff to check in the morning.</p>

Please read the information below regarding Free School Meals entitlement. Can I remind you that school benefits, as well as the family, when you sign up. Thank you



Free School Meals

At this time, many families may find themselves eligible for Free School Meals and Pupil Premium who previously did not meet the criteria. Please read this page carefully to find out if you are now eligible.

Cornwall Council are continuing to process new applications for Free School Meals. Please ensure that you read the eligibility criteria before applying and complete the online application form if you are eligible.

Postal applications are currently not being accepted but, if you are unable to apply online, you can call the Free School Meals team on 01872 323298 and a member of the team will call you back to complete the application over the phone. Please make sure that your phone will accept calls from a private / withheld number.

NB All Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative, regardless of what benefits are being claimed.

However, some children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 may also have an underlying entitlement to benefits-related Free School Meals. Please ensure that you check this and apply if appropriate, even if your child is in one of these year groups, because of the additional benefits (eg food vouchers during holiday times where these are given by the Government).

Your child may be eligible for benefits-related free school meals if their parent / carer (or the child themselves in their own right), receives any of the following benefits:

- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support
- Universal Credit - Your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are NOT eligible for free school meals, regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed:

- Working Tax Credit
- Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and / or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance

However, you will be temporarily eligible to claim free school meals if you receive a Working Tax Credit run-on, which is the payment you may receive for a further four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

If you think that your child is eligible for Free School Meals, we strongly recommend that you contact Cornwall Council as detailed above.

Well done to these children for showing excellent behaviour and learning attitudes. We are proud of you!
