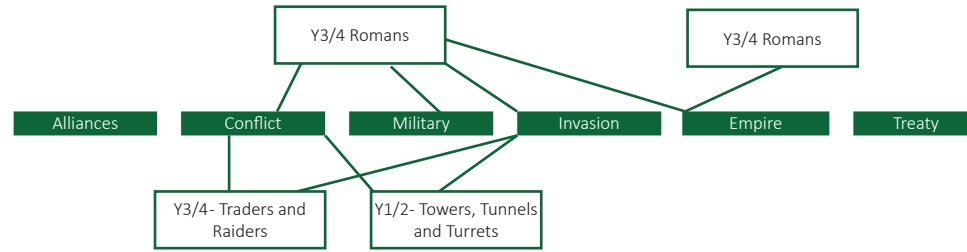


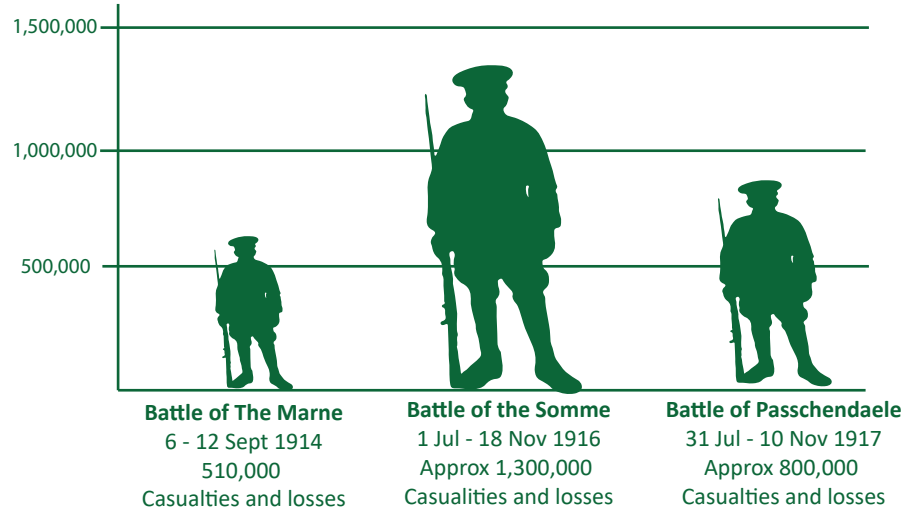

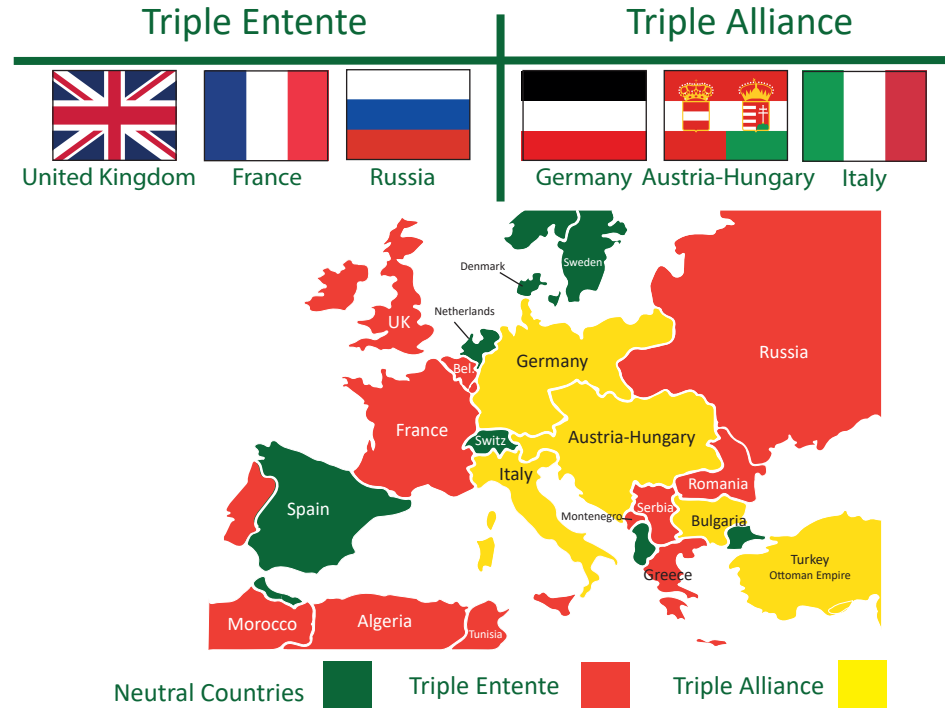

Vocabulary

- Artillery** Large, heavy guns used on land.
- Armistice** An agreement by both sides to stop fighting.
- Central Powers** The central powers included Germany, Austria-Hungary, the Ottoman Empire and Bulgaria.
- Empire** A group of countries ruled by a single person, government or country.
- Enlist** To join the army.
- PALs Battalions** Units in the British Army that grouped men who were friends and had enlisted together.
- Propaganda** Information used and shared to present one side of an argument.
- Recruitment** The process of encouraging people to join the army.
- Triple Entente** An alliance between a Britain, France and Russia.
- Treaty of Versailles** The treaty between the Allies and Germany that ended the War.

28th June 1914
Archduke Franz Ferdinand assassinated

28 Jul - 4 Aug 1914
Member of Triple Entente and Central Powers declare war

6 - 12 Sept 1914
The First Battle of the Marne

25 Dec 1914
The Christmas Truce

4 Feb 1915
Germany begins attacking British ships around the UK

7 May 1915
German submarine sinks the Luisitania

9 Sept 1915
Italy switches alliance and declares war on Austria-Hungary

1 Jul 1916
Battle of the Somme begins

6 Apr 1917
America declares war on Germany

9 Dec 1917
Russia and Germany agree to stop fighting

11 Nov 1918
Allied Powers and Germany sign agreement to stop fighting
