Learning outcomes:	Make sense of belief:  Recognise the words of the Shahadah and that it is very important for Muslims  Identify some of the key Muslim beliefs about God found in the Shahadah and the 99 names of Allah, and give a simple description of what some of them mean Recognise the words of the Shahadah and that it is very important for Muslims  Give examples of how stories about the Prophet show what Muslims believe about Muhammad  Understand the impact:  Give examples of how Muslims use the Shahadah to show what matters to them  Give examples of how Muslims use stories about the Prophet to guide their beliefs and actions (e.g. care for creation, fast in Ramadan)  Make connections:  Think, talk about and ask questions about Muslim beliefs and ways of living  Talk about what they think is good for Muslims about prayer, respect, celebration and self-control, giving a good reason for their ideas.	Make sense of belief:  Recognise that stories of Jesus' life come from the Gospels Give a clear, simple account of the story of Jesus' birth and why Jesus is important for Christians Understand the impact: Give examples of ways in which Christians use the story of the Nativity to guide their beliefs and actions at Christmas Make connections: Think, talk and ask questions about Christmas for people who are Christians and for people who are not Decide what they personally have to be thankful for, giving a reason for their ideas.	Make sense of belief:  Recognise the words of the Shahadah and that it is very important for Muslims  Give examples of how stories about the Prophet show what Muslims believe about Muhammad.  Understand the impact:  Give examples of how Muslims use stories about the Prophet to guide their beliefs and actions (e.g. care for creation, fast in Ramadan)  Give examples of how Muslims put their beliefs about prayer into action  Make connections:  Think, talk about and ask questions about Muslim beliefs and ways of living  Give a good reason for their ideas about whether prayer, respect, celebration and self-control have something to say to them too.  Talk about what they think is good for Muslims about prayer, respect, celebration and self-control, giving a good reason for their ideas	Make sense of belief:  Recognise that Incarnation and Salvation are part of a 'big story' of the Bible  Tell stories of Holy Week and Easter from the Bible and recognise a link with the idea of Salvation (Jesus rescuing people)  Understand the impact:  Give at least three examples of how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus' death and resurrection in church worship at Easter  Make connections:  Think, talk and ask questions about whether the story of Easter only has something to say to Christians, or if it has anything to say to pupils about sadness, hope or heaven, exploring different ideas and giving a good reason for their ideas.	Make sense of belief:  • Tell stories from the Bible and recognise a link with the concept of 'Gospel' or 'good news'  • Give clear, simple accounts of what Bible texts (such as the story of Matthew the tax collector) mean to Christians  • Recognise that Jesus gives instructions to people about how to behave  Understand the impact:  • Give at least two examples of ways in which Christians follow the teachings studied about forgiveness and peace, and bringing good news to the friendless  • Give at least two examples of how Christians put these beliefs into practice in the Church community and their own lives (for example: charity, confession)  Make connections:  • Think, talk and ask questions about whether Jesus' 'good news' is only good news for Christians, or if there are things for anyone to learn about how to live, giving a good reason for their ideas.	Make sense of belief:  Recognise that there are special places where people go to worship, and talk about what people do there  Identify at least three objects used in worship in two religions and give a simple account of how they are used and something about what they mean  Identify a belief about worship and a belief about God, connecting these beliefs simply to a place of worship  Understand the impact:  Give examples of stories, objects, symbols and actions used in churches, mosques and/or synagogues which show what people believe  Give simple examples of how people worship at a church, mosque or synagogue  Talk about why some people like to belong to a sacred building or a community  Make connections:  Think, talk and ask good questions about what happens in a church, synagogue or mosque, saying what they think about these questions, giving good reasons for their ideas  Talk about what makes some places special to people, and what the difference is between
